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Proceedings of the Public Hearing of M/s. Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd. (BPCL) for construction of Common User Facility (CUF) for storage of around 54,742 KL of Petroleum Products (i.e. Motor spirit or Petrol, High Speed Diesel, Ethanol, Biodiesel and Transmix) in proposed 20 nos. of above/underground tanks on behalf of all three PSU oil companies (M/s. HPCL, M/s. IOCL and M/s. BPCL) with M/s. BPCL as leading company at Meramandali in Dhenkanal District held on 14th November, 2018 at 11:00 AM inside the premises of Tahasil Office, Odapada in Dhenkanal district

Public Hearing of M/s. Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited for construction of a Common User Facility (CUF) for storage of around 54,742 KL of Petroleum Products (i.e. Motor spirit or Petrol, High Speed Diesel, Ethanol, Biodiesel and Transmix) in proposed 20 nos. of above/underground tanks on behalf of all three PSU oil companies (M/s. Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL), M/s. Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL) and M/s. Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL) with M/s. Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited as leading company at Meramandali in Dhenkanal District was held on 14th November, 2018 at 11:00 AM inside the premises of Tahasil Office, Odapada in Dhenkanal district.

Sri Purna Chandra Mishra, OAS (S), Additional District Magistrate, Dhenkanal supervised and presided over the meeting along with Dr. Sohan Giri, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Angul, Odisha.

At the outset, Dr. Sohan Giri, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Angul welcomed the public present in the meeting. He briefly described the objective of the public hearing as per the EIA Notification S.O. 1533 (E), dated 14th September, 2006 of the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Government of India. He informed the gathering about the change of location of propose project from Meramandali village to Sadashibapur near Sadasibapur Railway station under Odapada Tahasil of Dhenkanal district. He informed that, the date, time and venue for conducting the public hearing of M/s. Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd. for construction of Common User Facility (CUF) was advertised in the Odia daily "The Samaj" and the English Daily "The Times of India" on 12nd October, 2018 (Paper cuttings of the advertisements are enclosed as Annexure-I (A&B)).

Additional District Magistrate, Dhenkanal welcomed the public who were present at the venue for participating in the public hearing and informed about the objective of the public hearing.

Dr. Sohan Giri, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Angul, invited the Project Proponent to describe about the proposed project to the public present at the meeting. On behalf of the Project, Sri Manas Ranjan Mohanty, Head Infrastructure of M/s. Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL), Eastern Zone, welcomed the dignitaries on the dais and the gathering. He gave a brief introduction and informed that to develop a nation source of energy is required. After independence, India is growing day by day and for developing India source of energy is being full filled by three major oil refineries of India i.e. M/s. Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL), M/s. Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL) & M/s. Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL). Previously, M/s. Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited was a Navaratna Company but due to performance and efficiency it is recognized as Maharatna Company by Government of India. Also he briefed that, to make India as developed country two major source i.e. Electricity and Petroleum products are playing an important role. As India is a nation having high population, demand of petroleum products is increasing accordingly. Previously in India, overall demand for petroleum oil products was about 100 Million Metric Ton and now a days it crossed more than 200 Million Metric Tons to fulfill the requirement of the nation.

He mentioned that, India has only 40% indigenous crude oil but the demand is more than 200 MMT. To fulfill the demand of the nation mostly we depends on imports. Again he stated that with collaboration with Central Government and State Government they got an opportunity to install

oil depot at Sadasibapur. Also he informed that as this place is situated centrally in the state of Odisha, from here they will transport the petroleum products to all over the Odisha to fulfill the industrial as well as domestic demands. Also he stated that they will not set up an industry but only storage of petroleum oil will be carried out at the proposed place. They will store petrol, diesel and biodiesel in the tanks.

He started this project with collaboration and permission from State Government and the land acquisition process is under progress. He informed that as per the government norms most of the transportation will be done through pipeline only. So to reduce the transportation cost all the products will be transported by pipeline only and railway wagon will be there as stand by. He informed the gathering that, if this project will come then generation of employment will be there for the local people. As this is a storage unit only, so there will be neither stack nor any flue gas emission. He assured that it is a green project and no such pollution aspect will be there. As the petroleum products are flammable, so they will take necessary control measures to avoid any such type of mishap. They will take necessary consent from the Oil Industry Safety Directorate and from the Petroleum and Explosive Safety Organization, Nagpur. At the end, he appealed to the public to render support for the proposed project with a promise that if this project will come with a success, then they will take care of local peoples as well as peripheral development in and around the locality.

Dr. Sohan Giri, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Angul then invited the public to offer their views related to the proposed project. The views offered by the participants are highlighted below:

1. **Sri Bimal Kumar Pradhan, Baulapurpatna, Dhenkanal:** He started his deliberation by questioning the project proponent regarding the water pollution and type of preventive measures to be adopted to prevent oil spillage. He again asked about the direct employment procedure for the land losers.
2. **Sri Samarjeet Pattnaik, Sadashibpur, Dhenkanal:** He welcomed the dignitaries on the dais, gathering and company representatives. He asked the project proponent, whether the local peoples can engage their oil tanker in the company.
3. **Sri Iswar Chandra Rout, Sarapanch, Sadashibpur, Dhenkanal:** He welcomed the dignitaries on the dais and the gathering and introduced himself as the Sarapanch, Sadashibpur Gram Panchayat, Dhenkanal. He further stated that he was not aware about the land loser under his Panchayat jurisdiction. He alleged that why the public hearing is being held at Odapada Tahasil and insisted of public hearing in his Panchayat jurisdiction like Sadashibpur and Tentuliapada.
4. **Sri Hiranya Kumar Nayak, Baulapatna, Dhenkanal:** He welcomed the dignitaries on the dais and the gathering. He first extended his support to the project and specially requested the project proponent about the benefits they will get from the company, direct employment and the necessary measures to be taken for the control of emission of gas.
5. **Sri Baikuntha Lenka, Tentuliapada, Dhenkanal:** He greets the dignitaries on the dais and stated that, the people of village Tentuliapada have given their land for the project. He wants to know from the project proponent that, in the return what the steps the company will initiate for the direct employment of the land losers and other benefits they will get.
6. **Sri Samaleswariprasad Mallik, Baulapatna, Dhenkanal:** He welcomed the dignitaries on the dais and gathering. He introduced himself as representative of "Prastabita BPCL Oil Depot Birodhi Anchalika Jana Mancha" and told why one community is opposing the project and he requested the project proponent to respond his following questions.

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11. **Sri Bamdev Parida, Rasasinha, Dhenkanal:** He welcomed the dignitaries on the dais and gathering. He introduced himself as active representative of "Prastabita BPCL Oil Depot Birodhi Anchalika Jana Mancha". Also he stated that he continued their fight for right from 26th December, 2016. He was not aware about the change of location of public hearing from Meramandali. Since 2016, the land measurement starts for construction of this company and he saw most of the agents making promises that they will make their village as gold. Also he informed that no such things will happen in future. He informed that, he has downloaded from the website that they will get more jobs in the proposed project. He was not aware about if any changes made by the project proponent in present days. And the employees working in Sambalpur will come and work here. He also informed that previously for the proposed project, the proponent promised him to provide employment, hospital, medicines, drinking water facility, and electricity. He informed that till now they don't have good medical facility and depend upon Dhenkanal Hospital. Till now no employment opportunities is created by the project proponent and if the people got job, that on contractual basis. Also he stated that if the company is established and if any fire hazard will occur then no governmental personal and district administration will be present here. Then he elaborate that in Tentuliapada one Adarsha Vidyalaya was planned to be constructed, but due to this company the Adharsha Vidyalaya was relocated and company will be established here.
12. **Sri Laxmidhara Sahu, Baulapatna, Dhenkanal:** He started his deliberation with support to the project and said that they want to setup the project in the proposed place. The people who are opposing are biased through politically. Village from Tentuliapada and especially who are land losers, they want that the depot must be installed in the proposed place. Also he informed that 80% people of Baulapatana are land loser, so what type of benefit the project proponent will provide including medical facilities.
13. **Smt. Gayatri Mallik, Naib Sarapanch, Sadashibpur, Dhenkanal:** She welcomed the dignitaries on the dais and the gathering. She asked the project proponent how many people will get benefit due to the project and what type of preventive measure the project proponent will take for nuisance being created by the elephants in a regular manner.
14. **Sri Rajendra Lenka, Tentulipada, Dhenkanal:** He welcomed the project and stated that plant should be constructed in their village, the villagers are agreed for that. And he stated that they don't know why other people are opposing? He lost their land for the proposed project, so he strongly support to the project and said that any how the project may be established at the proposed place for their betterment.
15. **Sri Biswanatah Pradhan, Baulapatna, Dhenkanal:** He welcomed the proposed project with a request that as they are land losers and they don't have any objection for establishment of the project but due to the project the environment of the villages such as Baulapurpatna, Rasasingha, Tentuliapada and Sudharikateni should not be damaged. Environment of the region such not be damaged.

After completion of the deliberation process, the Regional Officer State Pollution Control Board, Angul, Odisha invited the representative of M/s. BPCL to present a brief note on the issues related to the demand and grievances of the local people raised during the public hearing.

Summary of the views of the project proponent on issues raised by the public in English and Odia (Vernacular language) is enclosed as **Annexure-II**. During public hearing the proponent has also submitted their commitments in writing, which is enclosed as **Annexure-III**.

After deliberation of the above, Additional District Magistrate, Dhenkanal concluded the meeting and expressed his gratitude to the public for expressing their views peacefully in the public hearing.

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- What is the reason behind the change of location of the proposed project from Meramandali to village Tentuliapada under Sadashibpur Gram Panchayat.
 - There is a human habitation near to the location of proposed project. Whether any sitting criteria/guideline is there confirming distance between nearest habitation and proposed project because they don't want any economical issues due to the project.
 - As the proposed land for the project is located near to the South Rengali Canal and areas along the Canal is irrigated crop fields, whether there will be any effect on crops due to the project.
 - Clarification regarding the actual employment potential, direct employment for the land losers, livelihood facilities for the land losers and the local peoples.
 - Clarification regarding loss of pastures lands and if any, then what alternatives will be adopted by the project proponent.
 - As the proposed project is coming in elephant crossing corridor and it is apprehended that elephants will change their regular path and move towards the village. Even now this area is elephant affected area. Therefore what preventive measures project proponent will take to avoid the nuisance created by the elephants.
 - What are the alternative sources that the project proponent has arranged for the land losers who are totally depend upon agriculture for their livelihood.
 - Lastly he conclude his deliberation with introducing himself one again that he is a representative of "Prastabita BPCL Oil Depot Birodhi Anchalika Jana Mancha" and they are fighting for their rights from December, 2016. They submitted their grievance several times to the District Administration and M/s. BPCL authority, but no such satisfactory reply has been given to them till now.
7. **Smt. Kumudini Giri, Tentuliapada, Dhenkanal:** She started and ended her deliberation with a question to the project proponent regarding the environmental pollution and what the measures they will take.
 8. **Sri Binay Kumar Parida, Rasasinha, Dhenkanal:** He welcomed the dignitaries on the dais and the gathering. He asked the authorities of M/s. BPCL, how far the human habitation should be there from the proposed project and what preventive measures will be taken by the project proponent for the fire hazards? They have also planned to construct their house adjacent to the proposed project area. He also apprehended that there is chance of ground water contamination due to leakage from underground oil storage tanks which will make their dug well and bore well water non-potable.
 9. **Sri Binay Kumar Sahani, Tentulipada, Dhenkanal:** He asked the project proponent regarding employment of children of land losers, drinking water facilities and conservation of their village temple.
 10. **Sri Pandav Charan Parida, Rasasinha, Dhenkanal:** He stated that, if the project will come then there will be movement of tankers in regular manner, then if any fire hazard will be occur due to spillage of petroleum products then what type of precautionary measure the project proponent will take and what compensation they will provide to the affected peoples. As they apprehended that there will be a fire hazard in their area, so they don't feel safe to stay there, hence he requested to relocate the project to another location.

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About 100 participants had attended the public hearing meeting and about 62 persons have put their signature in the attendance sheet whose list is annexed as Annexure-IV. 15 persons took part in the deliberation, whose list is annexed as Annexure-V. The video recording of the entire proceeding of the public hearing is enclosed as Compact Disc (CD). 10 written statements have been received from the public on the day of public hearing and the same is annexed as Annexure-VI.

Subject: Public Hearing in respect of EIA study for POL project of BPCL at Merhamundali/Sadashibpur

At the outset, we extend our sincere thanks to you, Mr. R.K. Mohanty, AEE from SPCB, Odisha, ADM-Dhenkanal and his team of officials for the smooth conduction of public hearing on the 14th Nov'2018 in compliance to the EIA study for the proposed POL terminal at Merhamundali – subsequently relocated to Sadashibpur.

It may kindly be noted that while during the process of public hearing we have presented details of the project before the audience and responded to specific issues/concerns raised by the public, we would like to submit the same hereunder for your reference & record.

Issues & Concerns:

1. **Project & its location:** The project is being developed as a Common User Facility (CUF) for BPCL, IOCL & HPCL. However, BPCL as the lead company is implementing the project by purchasing private lands through consent route belonging to nearby villages namely, Rasasing, Pasasing, Tentualipada & Baulpur etc. near Sadashibpur railway station. Although the project was initially envisaged for implementation at Merhamundali, it was subsequently relocated to the current location near Sadashibpur railway station owing to various considerations like, suitability of site, proximity to petroleum product pipeline & railway track, tank wagon siding feasibility etc.
2. **Employment:** The POL project which is basically a petroleum storage & distribution terminal for central Odisha could offer direct & indirect employment opportunities in various operational activities in line with Company's policy. Operation of the terminal will also increase employment opportunity in transportation sector as fleet of tank trucks shall be engaged in the distribution of petroleum products.
3. **Environmental Impact & Safety:** The terminal will operate as a storage and distribution point without any manufacturing activity. Therefore, there shall not be practically any effluents & emissions in the surrounding due to normal operation. Adequate greenbelt cover shall be provided as per statutory requirement.

The terminal shall be provided with state-of-art technology for timely detection and prevention of untoward incidents and also, for effective handling of emergency situations. The facility layout shall meet the applicable Oil Industry Safety Directorate Standards (OISD) as well as recommendations of MB Lal Committee applicable to POL terminals. The terminal will operate not only with all statutory approvals of the state government but also, with the license approval from Chief Controller of Explosives, PESO, Nagpur.


