

Proceedings of the Public Hearing meeting held on 26th December, 2018 at 10.30 AM at Majhapara Gram Panchayat Office, Block-Sadar in respect of M/s Mediaid Marketing Services for Development of Common Bio Medical Waste Treatment and Disposal Facility at Amsaranga Village, Tahasil-Sadar in Sundargarh District.

The public hearing of M/s Mediaid Marketing Services for Development of Common Bio Medical Waste Treatment and Disposal Facility at Amsaranga Village, Tahasil-Sadar in Sundargarh District was held on 26th December, 2018 at 10.30 AM at Majhapara Gram Panchayat Office, Tahsil-Sadar of Sundargarh District.

Sri Bhaskar Chandra Turuk, OAS (SAG), Additional District Magistrate, Sundargarh supervised and presided over the meeting along with Sri Hemendra Nath Nayak, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Rourkela, Odisha.

At the outset, Sri Hemendra Nath Nayak, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Rourkela welcomed the public present in the meeting. He briefly described the objective of the public hearing as per the EIA Notification S. O. 1533 (E), dated 14th September, 2006 of the Ministry of Environment, Forests & CC, Govt. of India. He informed that, the date, time and venue for conducting the public hearing of M/s Mediaid Marketing Services for Development of Common Bio Medical Waste Treatment and Disposal Facility at Amsaranga Village, Tahasil-Sadar in Sundargarh District, was advertised in the Odia Daily "Sambad" on 23.11.2018 and the English Daily, "The Times of India" on 24.11.2018 (**Paper cuttings of the advertisements are enclosed**).

Additional District Magistrate, Sundargarh welcomed the public who were present at the venue for participating in the public hearing and informed about the objective of the public hearing.

On behalf of the Project Proponent, Sri Ganesh Prasad Swain, Manager welcomed the dignitaries on the dais and the gathering. He gave a brief description about the proposed Common Bio Medical Waste Treatment and Disposal Facility. He stated that Government of India has notified Bio-medical Waste management Rules, where it is mandatory to treat the generated bio-medical waste in a scientific manner. The unit has already acquired 1.51 Acres of land for establishment of this project. He further informed that the main motto of the proposed project is to collect, transport, treat and dispose the

generated bio-medical waste in scientific manner with use of latest technology and without causing any environmental degradation. The generated flue gas from the incinerators will be treated through the lime scrubber before release to atmosphere to mitigate air pollution, proper lubrication and maintenance of machineries will be carried out to control the noise level and green belt will be developed around the unit. He mentioned that a detail environment management plan has also been prepared for this project. He further added that by establishment of this project the Sundargarh District will be benefitted as the infectious waste generated from the health care units will be properly treated. He has also informed that this project will also create employment opportunity for local public. Around 30 persons will be engaged in the project and priority will given to local public. About 70 % of the total employments will be given to the local public in non-technical grade. He also appealed to the public to extend their support for this project as this would lead to a clean and disease free environment.

The Additional District Magistrate, Sundargarh invited the public to offer their views related to the Development of Common Bio Medical Waste Treatment and Disposal Facility by the M/s Mediaid Marketing Services. The views offered by the participants are enclosed as **Annexure-IV**.


The Summary of the Issues raised by the participants in the public hearing in Odia & English (Vernacular language) is enclosed as **Annexure-V (A&B)**.

After completion of the deliberation process, the Additional District Magistrate, Sundargarh invited the representative of M/s Mediaid Marketing Services to present a brief note on the issues related to the demand and grievances of the local people raised during the public hearing.

Summary of the views of the project proponent on issues raised by the public in Odia & English (Vernacular language) are enclosed as **Annexure-VI (A&B)**. The proponent has also submitted a written assurance during public hearing, which is enclosed as **Annexure-VIII**.

After deliberation of the above and concluding statement by the Additional District Magistrate, Sundargarh, Er. Deepak Kumar Sahoo, Asst. Env. Engineer, State Pollution Control Board, Rourkela gave vote of thanks at the end of public hearing.
