

PROCEEDINGS OF THE PUBLIC HEARING MEETING HELD ON 15.12.2021 (AT 11.00 AM) AT PALEI GRAM PANCHAYAT OFFICE FOR ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE IN RESPECT OF SUKHUAPADA DECORATIVE STONE MINES OF M/S ODISHA MINING CORPORATION LIMITED OVER ML AREA OF 46.159 HA LOCATED AT VILLAGE BANDARESWAR NO. 1219 & KESARAIPUR NO. 1218 UNDER DARPAN TEHSIL IN THE DISTRICT OF JAJPUR, ODISHA

The public hearing in respect of the Sukhuapada Decorative Stone Mines of M/s Odisha Mining Corporation Limited over an area of 46.159 Ha at Village Bandareswar No. 1219 & Kesaraipur No. 1218, Tehsil Darpan in Jajpur District was held on scheduled date & time at Palei Gram Panchayat Office in the District of Jajpur with reference to EIA Notification S.O 1533 (E) Dtd. 14.09.2006 and amendments thereof.

The Panel consisted of the following members:

1. Sri Akshaya Kumar Mallick, Additional District Magistrate (Revenue), Jajpur, Odisha
2. Sri Pramod Kumar Behera, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Kalinganagar.

Sri Akshay Kumar Mallick, Additional District Magistrate (Revenue), Jajpur, supervised & presided over the public hearing process and assisted by Sri Pramod Kumar Behera, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Kalinganagar, the representative of State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Bhubaneswar.

At the outset, welcoming the members participated in the meeting Sri Pramod Kumar Behera, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Kalinganagar, gave a brief introduction about the guidelines to be followed for the public hearing in the light of EIA Notification, 2006 and interim operational guidelines till date, in respect of Sukhuapada Decorative stone mine over an area of 46.159 Ha at village Bandareswar No. 1219 & Kesaraipur No. 1218, Tehsil Darpan in Jajpur District.

Welcoming the public, Sri A. K. Mallick. Additional District Magistrate (Revenue), Jajpur welcomed the public and explained that the views, comments, objections and opinions of the public are necessary while considering the environmental clearance of the project. He reminded public that the Public Hearing meeting is being conducted following the Social distancing and COVID-19 guideline. He requested the public to follow the Social distancing and COVID guidelines during the public hearing process. He asked the project proponent to make a brief presentation before the public gathered in the meeting about the various aspects of the proposed project to be undertaken for better awareness of the public.

Sri Subrat Kumar Behera, OAS (SAG), Deputy Administrator (Revenue), Shree Jagannath Temple Administration, Puri greeted the dais and welcomed the public to the public hearing meeting. Sri Behera informed the public that, stone to be excavated from the



mine shall be used for corridor work of Sri Jagannath temple, Puri. He asked the public to give their valuable suggestions.

On behalf of the project proponent, Sri Gangadhar Naik, Regional Manager of M/s. Odisha Mining Corporation Limited briefed the mining proposal and Environmental impact of Sukhuapada Decorative stone mine during production of Decorative stone over an area of 46.159 Ha. He addressed the dais and assembled public and made a brief presentation about the salient features of the proposed project, environmental management, pollution control measures, afforestation programme and various other peripheral development activities envisaged in the proposed project.

Then Sri Mallick, ADM (Revenue), Jajpur, requested the public to give their views, comments and opinions on the proposed project.

The views expressed by various speakers on the proposed project are as follows:

1. Sri Ashok Samal, Bandareswar

Sri Samal greeted the dais and gathering. He expressed his happiness that stone from their area will be utilized in Jagannath Temple and told that it is a proud moment for them. He demanded plantation and road maintenance from Kesharaipur to Bandreswar. He further told that Banana, Coconut and Fish cultivation is being carried out by local people at the bottom of the hill. He raised concern that agriculture may be affected due to dust pollution. He requested the district Administration to look into the matter. He informed that the hill is the livelihood of that area. Further, people of Karigari Sahi of Sukhuapada village have worked at all India level and also at Global level. Their art has given live to stone. In one part of that hill, worship place of Grama Devi, Languli Matha and Tala Matha is located. He further demanded that livelihood of artisan should not be affected and the worship places should be protected, artisan should get stone from one part of the hill, road from Sukhuapada to Bandareswar Chhaka and road from Kesharaipur to Bandareswar Chhaka should be lighted in both sides. He expressed his support for the project.

2. Sri Prafulla Das, Bandareswar

Sri Das welcomed the gathering and expressed his support for the proposed project so that stone from Bandreswar, Sukhuaparha hill will be utilized for Jagannath Temple work. He requested before project proponent and the District Administration to look after the basic amenities. He demanded the project proponent to take care of the artisan of Bandareswar and Kesharaipur, environment, lighting the road from Sukhuapada to Kesharaipur and connecting road from Kesharaipur to Bandareswar. He further demanded that agriculture land near Kesharaipur such as Banana, Coconut and fish cultivation should not be affected.



3. Sri Sarat Jena, Palei

Sri Jena expressed his support for the project and told that by the grace of Lord Jagannath, stone from their area will be utilized in Jagannath temple Corridor work. He requested the proponent to protect the monuments, if found any during mining operation.

4. Sri Mahesh Samal, Bandareswar

Sri Samal welcomed the panel and expressed his support for the project. He raised concern that the road from Bandareswar to Kesharaipur may get damaged due to movement of heavy vehicles during mining operation. He demanded construction of concrete wall around Kasha Nalla, protection of agriculture, fish cultivation at the bottom of the hill and planted trees be protected, dust pollution be controlled during mining operation. He further requested not to affect the Grama Devi Kapilashuni, LanguliMatha and Tarini Devi Mandir at bottom of hill.

5. Sri Braja Kishore Maharana, Sukhuapada

He told that he feels proud that stone will go to JagannathDham, but raised his concern on how artisan will continue their livelihood. He demanded the project proponent to take care of the livelihood of artisan, take step for environmental protection, electrification of Kesharaipur, Bandaneswar&Sukhuapada village road.

6. Sri Bikram Kishore Pradhan, Palei

Sri Pradhan supported the project. He expressed his concern regarding livelihood of local artisan. He requested that portion of hill may be protected to provide livelihood to local artisan.

7. Sri ChittaRanjanMaharana, Sukhuapada

He greeted the panel & gathering and told that some artisans are living at the bottom of the hill. He demanded protection of their houses, cattle and livelihood.

8. Sri SunakarParida, Kesharaipur

Sri Parida expressed his support that for the project. He told that if mining will be carried out in Kesharaipur then their livelihood will be affected. 90% of people in Kesharaipur village are of Schedule Cast Category and they maintain their life through domesticated animal, depend the hill for wood. There is no cremation ground in Kesharaipur, the last rite of people is being done in that hill. He raised concern that mining dust will affect the health of people, agriculture field, and drainage system and raise the possibility of earthquake. He requested the project proponent to take care of all those things.

9. Sri SrisharaMaharana, Lalitgiri

Sri Maharana opposed the project. He told that the site is a historical place. Hiuen-T-Sang in his book Dynasty of western kingdom wrote about PuspagiriPanchalaya. The



area is the PuspaGiriPanchalaya, 2000 years historical place will be destroyed by the project. So many migratory birds also come to the place. He told the presence of Green Munia Bird, 7 to 8 Hyna in the area. Biodiversity of the area may get destroyed by the project. He expressed his concern regarding livelihood of the local artisan, landslide due to drilling operation. He informed presence of two monasteries namely LanguliMatha and TalaMatha in the area. He told that due to mining, the area will face dust pollution, noise pollution and also education of Children will be affected. He informed that his grandfather DhrubCharanMaharana has carried out the repair work of Konark Temple during British Period. He expressed his grievance on non-construction of roads in the area even after 75 years of Independence. He further informed that local people are not getting the basic amenities and mining in the area will bring environment degradation and loss of biodiversity.

10. Sri SrikantaSamal, Bandareswar

He welcomed the gathering and expressed his concern regarding livelihood of local artisan. He complained that BhumiPujan has been conducted by Administration, without approval of the public. He demanded to create a committee with the artisans and laborers who are dependent on the hill for consultation. He demanded road, protection of livelihood of the artisan, Plantation, environment protection, protection of agriculture etc. Finally, he told that stone mining should be carried out as per rules and regulation and proper procedure.

11. Sri Nilu Prasad Sing, Kesharaipur

Sri Sing welcomed the Panel and told that 90% of villagers are unknown that BhumiPujan has already been conducted. He demanded to take care of all issues already raised by earlier speakers.

12. Sri Prafulla Panda, Keshraipur

Sri Panda welcomed that, stone from Sukhuapada mines will go to Puri Sri Jagannath Temple. He supported the project. He informed that they have already submitted a letter regarding different local issues to the Collector and that the district administration will take step for fulfillment of their issues. He proposed that mines name should be written as Bandareswar, Kesharaipur&Sukhuapada mines instead of Sukhuapada mines.

13. Sri SoumyaRanjanMoharana, Sukhuapada

He told that everybody has told everything and demanded protection of livelihood of local artisan and environment protection in the area

14. Sri Umesh Prasad Samal, Bandareswar

He welcomed the Panel and informed that the lease was cancelled by the Govt. since 1980 because of the heritage site and local habitation at the bottom of the hill.

Some portion of hill at Hatikhala has already been taken by Archaeological Department. He told that people of Karigaribasti at Sukhuapada fulfill their livelihood by making stone craft only. He further informed that Olasuni Eco tourism site is nearer to the site, there is a proposal of ropeway and deer park in Olasuni hill. This is a golden triangle connecting Puspagiri, Lalitgiri and Ratnagiri, some afforestation activities has been carried out by Forest Dept. in Olasuni and Sukhuapada hill. He proposed that Govt. may take stone from alternate places where pollution density is less. LanguliMatha and other several Matha is present in the hill, many Hyna live in the hill, no such development work has been carried out in the area, and many temples at the bottom of hill are not in good conditions. He expressed his concern regarding impact of dust pollution. He told that, in case of no alternative site, the Govt. may take stone from the place but they should take necessary step for environment protection and ensure that the locality is not affected by the mining project.


15. Sri Kshiroda Maharana, Lalitgiri


He told that first of all, this is a World Heritage Site. Lalitgiri is a heritage site. This is a place of 2500 years historic evidence. Near Gadi hill pandabs were staying. There is Hatikhala, LanguliMatha and TalaMatha. This heritage site should be protected. He says that if stone is required for Jagannath Temple, there are so many hills from where stone can be taken, why Puri will be great every time, Budha should also get respect.

16. Sri Bindusagar Samal, Bandareswar

He welcomed the Panel and told that administration has never fulfill their commitment. He show concern regarding local people he express his concern regarding Craft village, road development and for local people, Separate road should be constructed for mineral transportation.

18 persons had registered to deliberate their views but 16 persons deliberated their views. The Panel has received 4 nos. of written representations during the hearing. Sri Akshay Kumar Mallick, ADM (Revenue), Jajpur asked the project proponent to present their comments to the people with respect to the demands raised by the public in the public hearing meeting. Sri Debendra Kumar Nanda, Chief Vigilance officer of M/s Odisha Mining Corporation Limited, made the commitment on issues raised by the public. The statement of issues and concern of the public with comments of the applicant prepared in English & Odia language are annexed separately. The meeting was ended with thanks to the chair.

Other peripheral development 	<p>Sri Debendra Kumar Nanda, Chief Vigilance officer of M/s Odisha Mining Corporation Limited, committed to certain issues raised by the public are as follows:</p> <p>Sri Nanda expressed his happiness that people came forward and expressed their views, suggestions and complaints in the public hearing. He informed that stone will be mined scientifically and as OMC is a Govt. company; all necessary steps will be taken for environment protection. He further elaborated that as per the survey, stone quality to be used for the temple work should meet some specific conditions as per the GSI and from the survey, the stone quality from Sukhuapada mine has been found to be suitable for the proposed corridor work of Jagannath temple, Puri.</p> <p>He informed that out of the huge deposit, M/s OMC Ltd. is going to mine only 0.5% of the total deposit. He told that they have not started any bhumi puja at the site. He assured that bhumi puja will take place as per rituals and consent of the local public.</p> <p>He told that no explosion will take place during mining. Stone will be cut only by diamond saw cutter. M/s OMC will supply the stone free of cost to the Shree Jagannath Temple Administration, Puri. Water sprinklers will be used to suppress dust during mining</p>




activity to curb air pollution. Garland drain and boundary wall shall be provided during mining, so that nearby area will not be affected by any land slide. There will be no issue of water pollution due to mining activity.

The existing monuments shall be protected and any monuments found during mining shall be protected by handing over to Archeological survey of India.

As per the survey, detail study has been carried out and no wild animals will be affected by the mining work, special care will be taken on the issue.

Small size stones that will not be used for the temple work shall be provided to M/s Utkalika and subsequently sufficient stone will be provided to the stone artisan in the entire state through Utkalika.

Plantation will be carried out in collaboration with the local community.

Road development work of Bandareswar and Sukhuapada will be carried out as per discussion with the district Administration. Street light proposal shall be submitted to the higher authority for taking further decision.


CSR activity will be carried out by OMC in consultation with local public and district administration.

OMC will identify agricultural land and fish cultivation going to be affected by the mining activity and take step accordingly.

Road and drain facility shall be constructed by the District Administration. 
