
NOTICE

ATTENTION –Occupiers of all Health Care Facilities (both bedded & non-bedded) in Southern Odisha

This is brought to the notice of **the occupiers of all the Health Care Facilities (HCFs)** (both bedded & non-bedded) in Southern Odisha that a new Common Biomedical Waste Treatment & Disposal Facility (CBWTF) namely M/s. Mediaid Marketing Services has been granted with Authorization and Consent to Operate of the Board for operation at Vill: Arakhapada, Tehsil-Seragada in Ganjam District. As per the provisions of Biomedical Waste Management Rules, 2016 it is the duty of every occupier generating biomedical waste to take all necessary steps to ensure that the biomedical waste is handled without any adverse effect to human health and the environment and in accordance with these Rules. These Rules shall apply to all persons who generate, collect, receive, store, transport, treat, dispose, or handle bio-medical waste in any form including hospitals, nursing homes, clinics, dispensaries, veterinary institutions, animal houses, pathological laboratories, blood banks, ayush hospitals, clinical establishments, research or educational institutions, health camps, medical or surgical camps, vaccination camps, blood donation camps, first aid rooms of schools, forensic laboratories and research labs.

Under the provisions of these Rules, no occupier shall establish on-site treatment and disposal facility, if a service of common bio-medical waste treatment facility is available at a distance of seventy-five kilometer. All such Health Care Facilities have been granted with authorization based on captive facilities in absence of a CBWTF. After establishment of a CBWTF in the region, all such facilities/establishments are


required to hand over the Biomedical Waste to CBWTF in stead of treating and disposing it onsite. Hence, all HCFs in Southern Odisha are requested to avail the services of above mentioned CBWTF for proper treatment of biomedical waste within a period of 3 months i.e. by 31.08.2020 in accordance with the provisions of Biomedical Waste Management Rules, 2016.
